However, interpreting eventually became her true calling to best utilize her skills, knowledge, and abilities, where she has worked for over 20 years in various settings. During that time, she and her husband decided to become foster parents. Her family, including their 3 boys, became a foster family for 8 years, ultimately adopting 3 amazing Deaf daughters. These experiences required interfacing heavily with Child Protective Services, highlighting the dearth of information and education for interpreting services, especially working with children who had experienced trauma. This became the impetus for developing training to address this unmet need in the field. Her "free" time is spent enjoying time with her husband & 6 kids (2 in college) at their sporting events as well as camping, going to movies, and working in her yard.
